What does it look like to create trails and outdoor spaces that are more inviting, inclusive, and supportive of people living with different disabilities? How can we rethink outdoor spaces and how we communicate about them to welcome people who have historically been marginalized in conservation and the outdoors? Please note that this workshop is not designed to advise participants on how to build or modify trails to make them fully compliant with federal legislation; rather, instruction focuses on making immediate, attainable shifts to trails, infrastructure, and communications that begin to welcome and accommodate a greater number of people looking to be active outdoors. 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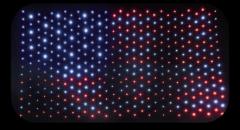

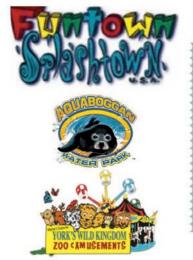

ACCOUNTABILITY Accept responsibility for your words and actions. Be aware of your power, positionality, and privilege.

ONGOING LEARNING Engage with materials and new information with curiosity and an open mind. Have courage to challenge ideas and ask questions to seek understanding. Recognize that everyone is as different points in their learning and give room for others to learn without judgment.

SPEAK YOUR TRUTH Say what you know to be true for you and your experience.

CONFIDENTIALITY Personal information shared in workshops or meetings should not be shared outside the session. Lessons go. Stories stay.

WAIT (Why Am I Talking?) Be conscious of why you are (or are not) sharing. Be willing to share air time.

EXPECT NON-CLOSURE Not every question or challenge can be resolved in one session or meeting.
